
TRACK CHART

CAUSE OF DEATH Plane was hit, and I was knocked unconscious. The next thing I remember, I found myself safely on the ground after having either jumped automatically or having been pushed out. I did not see the plane after I was knocked out. I saw or heard about all the rest of the crew later, but I never saw or heard anything about the Waist Gunner.

all members of the crew climbed in, to me off
we were hit, except 1/Lt. Reis who was caught
in the top turret. And was getting out, he freed
himself, and pulled and pushed Lt. Egan to crawl
out of the plane. This was done while the
ship was on its way down and I felt 1/Lt.
Reis should be entitled to something for his
actions. He, 1/Lt. Reis, was injured, and only
had one eye, the left had been injured, during
the fight. I am certain he lit the leader
of the flight of seven ships (F4U-190s) which
were responsible for downing our plane.

1/Lt. Reis, received his injury when the
aircraft ship, and the rest of the flight of (900s)
opened up. He was pinned between the top turret
right and the left wing housing.

The above actions occurred on 30 and 31
1940.
