4. ROUTE SCHEDULED - LEFT SOUTHERN ENGLAND ON A MAGNETIC HEADING OF 180°, FIRST TURNING POINT WAS ELEURS, FRANCE. FROM FLERS WE WERE TO TAKE A HEADING OF 155°, FOR APPROX. 20 MI. THEN WE WERE TO TAKE A NORTHEAST HEADING LEADING TOTHE I.P. ANDTHE BEGINNING OF THE BOMB RUN. HEADING POWN BOMB AUN WAS TO BE APPROX. 90°, THEN TURN NORTH AND HEAD BACK TO ENGLAND, (THIS IS AS CLOSE AS I CAN REMEMBER THE ROUTE) WE WERE HIT OVER FLERS, BUT WE TURNED ON TO THE NEW HEADING AND FLEW WITH THE FORMATION FOR MAYBE 4 OR 5 MW. 
